- Closing date for entries 17th July. Entries received after this date will only be accepted at the discretion of the Horse Secretary and on payment of a penalty of £1.00 per class.**

- NO ENTRIES ARE TAKEN ON THE DAY, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF SHOW JUMPING AND FANCY DRESS WHICH ARE ONLY ON THE DAY**
- Please ensure you have read the Society Rules in this schedule. Further information and all entry forms are available on the website – **www.weetonshow.co.uk**
- No entries accepted unless accompanied by correct entry fees and stamped addressed envelope.
- Entries in Horse and Pony Section **MUST** quote name and age of horse and name and age of rider (where applicable)
- Entries of £5.00 or more will entitle the exhibitor to one exhibitor ticket; entries over £10 will entitle the exhibitor to two exhibitor tickets. Exhibitor tickets will not be posted for entries received after the closing date. Anyone without an exhibitor's ticket **will be charged for entry to the showground.**
- Hard hats/skull caps, that conform to current B.S.I standards or above, must be worn when mounted on the showground, at all times.
- There is a compulsory payment of £1.00 for each competitor to cover the provision of medical services.
- The organisers accept no liability whatsoever for any accident, damage, injury, illness to horses/owners/riders or any other person or property.
- Exhibitors are reminded that it is their responsibility to insure against damage caused by their animals.
- Objections must be made in writing to the General Secretary with a deposit of £10. See Society rule 14.
- All cups and trophies are to be returned to the Trophy Secretary 3 weeks before the show. See Society rule 19.

50. PLEASURE DRIVING – is for newcomers to showing and not intended for those who show in private driving classes, it will be judged 15% on vehicle suitability, fit and cleanliness, 15% on harness suitability, fit and cleanliness and 70% on driver and groom, horse/pony's way of going and suitability as a family pleasure driving animal. Competitors may be required to execute specific movements in their individual show in order to demonstrate their driving skill, for example U turns, driving between cones, and any other task, at the Judges discretion. Dress less formal, open to horses, ponies, donkeys and mules; single, pair or tandem driven to a traditional or non traditional vehicle capable of seating 2 or more persons. Pneumatic tyres are allowed and lamps are optional.

51. LIGHT TRADE TURNOUT

52. PRIVATE DRIVING (No show drive) Horse or pony driven to a traditional or traditional type vehicle. Pneumatic tyre vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible.

This class is a **qualifier for the 2010 Osborne Refrigerators BDS National Championships** for the highest placed single turnout driven to a traditional type vehicle in the following sections:

- o) driven by a young driver aged 10-14 years who is a member of the British Driving Society
- p) driven by a young driver aged 15-17 years who is a member of the British Driving Society

disregarding those already qualified down to 10th place, will qualify for the 2010 semi-finals. Also for members of the British Driving Society driving:

- g) Single purebred Registered Welsh Ponies – Sections A & B
- h) Single Registered Mountain & Moorland (excluding purebred Registered Welsh)
